RRA Members to Train with First Responders

The Roadside Responders Association (RRA) is inviting police forces and fire departments to join RRA members for a Traffic Incident Management (TIMS) Seminar on September 30, 2015. The seminar is sponsored by the Roadside Responders Association, the Nova Scotia Department of Transportation, Wreckmaster, Sykes Canada, and Allstate Roadside,

The full day of training will be taught by Bruce Campbell from Banff, Alberta — one of only fifteen Certified Wreckmaster Lead Instructors in North America. We currently expect to see about 150 individuals attending the seminar on September 30, 2015, at the Ramada Inn in Dartmouth. All towing participants must register for the TIMS seminar before August 28 and be a current paid member of the RRA.

This will be the first time that tow operators have trained alongside other first responders. The seminar will explain the theory of traffic incident management and identify the role that the towing and recovery industry plays in the quick clearance of highway incidents. With traffic accidents being the leading cause of death for first responders and tow truck operators, the quick clearance of roadways can be a lifesaver for first responders, essential service providers, and other motorists.
